

In Memoriam Alfred May January 22, 1930 - March 10, 2018

It is with deep sadness that we share news of the passing of Alfred May on Saturday, March 10, 2018 at the age of 88. Mr. May founded Hercules Corporation in 1959 with an inventory of only two washers, one dryer and an old truck, and built it into the largest family-owned laundry room provider in the country.



Mr. May opened his first laundry facility in the Bronx. Today, 59 years later, Hercules operates laundry facilities in over 5,000 co-ops, condominiums, rental buildings and colleges/universities in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut and Pennsylvania, serving landlords, property managers and co-op and condominium boards throughout the region.


Mr. May's insight and wisdom within the industry was unmatched. Even after retiring to Hallandale, Florida, Mr. May was still deeply involved in the business, calling the office daily, asking for updates and sharing his past experiences with specific industry veterans he had worked with.

Mr. May recently shared a wonderful story about his occupation prior to going into business for himself. Interestingly, he revealed that it was actually his mom's idea who said "Al, go into the laundry business, because it's inflation proof and people will always have to do wash." Mr. May followed his guiding principle in business — give people the attention they deserve, be honest and sincere about what you are doing, and work hard. Mr. May also credits his wife as having had the most important influence on him - "She allowed me to do so many things and she gave me so much confidence, and we really enjoyed our lives together."

Al May will forever be remembered for the love of his family, especially his late wife, Elaine May, who was the love of his life for 47 years. With three children who they loved and adored, along with nine grandchildren and a great-grandson, the family was the most important part of Mr. May's life throughout his years at Hercules and in retirement.

Mr. May will forever be missed by all of the many employees at Hercules. Whether it was talking business, or his love of almost all professional sports, Mr. May lived a full and rewarding life, both personally and professionally.

115 Ocean Avenue Brooklyn, NY







Located in the Prospect Lefferts Gardens neighborhood in Brooklyn, NY, 115 Ocean Avenue is a 6 story, 86-unit high-rise, pre-war building built in 1925.

Managed by Jonas Equities, Property Manager Moshe Rhine worked tirelessly to completely transform the existing laundry room at 115 Ocean Avenue into a clean, inviting and efficient laundry room that the residents would feel comfortable using. Gotham West 530/550 West 45th Street - NYC











Welcome to Gotham West, Hell's Kitchen's hottest new rental building, completed in 2013 and built by the Gotham Organization.

Gotham West is a 32-story tower at 550 West 45th Street on the southeast corner at 11th Avenue. It is part of a nearly full-block complex of 1,238 rental apartments in total, housed in four buildings, stretching to Tenth Avenue. Residents can enjoy the use of multiple Hercules laundry rooms, incorporating the newest technology from Maytag, Wascomat and American Dryer, throughout the complex including the new Hercules CleanPay Mobile app, enabling residents the ability to start the washers and dryers without the use of a Smart Card.



Knickerbocker Village 10 Monroe Street - NYC









During the late 1920's and early 30's, development of large apartment complexes began in New York City. Knickerbocker Village, the affordable housing complex, was among the first to be developed, between the Manhattan and Brooklyn Bridges, on the Lower East Side of Manhattan. Construction for Knickerbocker Village began in 1933 and was completed in 1934.

The complex consists of 1,590 apartments in twelve, 13-story brick buildings, surrounding two courtyards. Each building houses a Hercules laundry room, with the very latest in Speed Queen, Maytag and Wascomat laundry machines.

INTERESTING FACT

During the 1940's and 50's, the complex was home to Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, who were convicted of spying for the Soviet Union and executed. It would seem that their activities were orchestrated from their apartment.



Cornell Tech Roosevelt Island - 1 East Loop Road









Cornell Tech is an engineering campus located on Roosevelt Island in Manhattan. It is anchored by the Jacobs Technion-Cornell Institute, a joint academic venture between Cornell University and the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology.

The 270-foot-tall residential high-rise, referred to as "The House at Cornell Tech" is a full-service apartment building, not a traditional dorm, using 60-70 percent less energy than typical buildings. Living on campus at The House is on par with the offerings of many high-end residences in NYC, with an abundance of amenities, including a new Hercules laundry room outfitted with Maytag Commercial Energy Advantage Front Load washers and Maytag Commercial Single-Load Capacity Stack dryers, providing convenience and reliability.

695 Grand Street Brooklyn, NY







A fully affordable building in the Williamsburg section of **Brooklyn**, **695 Grand Street** is an eight-story, 51-unit building developed by St. Nicks Alliance, a nonprofit community development organization with financing by NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development and NYS Housing and Community Renewal.

Founded in 1975, St. Nicks Alliance is one of the oldest and most accomplished community development groups in NYC. Having developed more than 2,200 units of affordable housing and managing more than 1,400 units for low- and moderate- income families and special needs populations, St. Nicks Alliance seeks to transform lives of low- and moderate-income people through employment, education, and housing. Included in **695 Grand Street** are 12 apartments set aside for the formerly homeless.

The 80,000-square-foot structure is nearing the finish line, and is set to wrap construction by the end of 2018. Hercules will be installing an energy efficient Maytag equipment package for the new centralized laundry room, with new High Efficiency Front Load washers and Single Load Stack dryers, along with the new Kiosoft Smart Card revaluing unit.



Mt. Pleasant Laundromat 993 Dryden Road - Ithaca, NY









Ithaca, New York is home to Cornell University, Ithaca College and now the newly renovated Mt. Pleasant Laundromat, now operated by Hercules.




FAMOUS SITCOM RESIDENCES

The Nanny: This Fran Drescher classic involves Queens native Fran Fine (Drescher) becoming the nanny of three wealthy British children on New York's Upper East Side (7 East 75th Street was the building used for exteriors), who eventually falls in love and marries her boss, Maxwell Sheffield (Charles Shaughnessy)



Seinfeld: For all of those unannounced pop-ins at Jerry's apartment, Jason Alexander's character, George Costanza was actually quite a distance away, as he resided at 321 West 90th Street.



30 Rock: NBC head writer, Liz Lemon, played by Tina Fey, lived at 160 Riverside Drive in the weekly sitcom. In later seasons, Liz moved to the non-existent 168 Riverside Drive – perhaps the real building was no longer interested in exterior filming.



Will and Grace: Sitcom characters Will and Grace lived directly across from Liz Lemon, residing at 155 Riverside Drive.



Mad Men (Season 4): The Waverly, located at 136 Waverly Place in Greenwich Village, served as the home of newly-divorced Don Draper.
