Our Hercules Field Service Technicians and Installers have shown their commitment and diligence throughout these challenging times. Our priority since March 2020 has been to keep our laundry rooms trouble-free and operating at peak efficiency, while we also continue to install new laundry rooms.

Covid-19's impact at Hercules created a severe shortage of parts and materials resulting in a significant impact on the installation and the time to repair of our laundry equipment.

The scale of this disruption has affected not only our business, but overall has had a significant impact on production, demand, and supply chains. Delays in product deliveries are now widespread. As a result of these shortages, Hercules is dealing with unprecedented demand combined with the fallout from parts and equipment shortages.

As you are also certainly aware, many of the very same manufacturing industries that we deal with and rely on each day, are struggling, as they are facing a growing skilled labor shortage. This has had a significant impact on our business as well, resulting in the production shortages that we have been experiencing.

Please understand that we are continuing to do everything that we can to work around all of these challenges. Our suppliers are looking to boost capacity by adding staff, while also incorporating new safety mandates throughout all of their factories, in an effort to maintain steady production. We appreciate your feedback and expect that our service and equipment installation time frames will be at more acceptable levels soon, but please be patient in the interim.

Thank you for your understanding, and of course, we will continue to keep you updated.

Favorite vacation spot?


I really enjoy taking a vacation on a cruise ship.




What would you do if you won the lottery?

Troubleshooting laundry problems



DO YOU HAVE **ANY TIPS TO KEEP WORKOUT WEAR** SMELLING FRESH?

Before we tackle washing tips, here's why workout wear can smell funky: Tightly knit athletic fabrics have dense textures to help wick away sweat, but if not washed correctly, they can hold on to body soils and odor-causing bacteria even after be-ing washed. Then the next time you wear your leggings or sports bra and start to sweat, the fabric expands and releases those trapped odors.

The best way to keep these hardworking fabrics smelling fresh is to air them out after wearing them and launder them promptly.

Wash them separately using the cycle and water temperature recommended on the care label. You should also be sure the washer isn't overloaded so the items can move freely.

WHAT DOES "MOISTURE-**WICKING" MEAN?** Is it necessary in work-out clothes?

Moisture-wicking fabrics take the sweat off your skin and dry quickly so you'll stay comfortable and cool. While this feature is essential in everything from sports bras to leggings, not all

activewear is truly moisture-wicking: Some fabrics absorb sweat and then stay wet, while others dry quickly but keep



sweat stuck on you. To check yours, place a drop of water on the inside of the fabric where it touches your skin. The liquid should quickly be absorbed and spread out. If it beads up or sinks in but doesn't spread out, chances are that the item will leave you soaked during your sessions.

Helga Stentzel is a Russian-born visual artist, known for her 'household surrealism' series which uses her household objects in her art, particularly laundry and food to create characters and scenes. She works across a wide range of media including illustration, photography, video and stop motion animation.




